  - c) Understanding of Africa's regional integration agenda and key AfCFTA issues.
  - d) Knowledge of trade and/or IPR;
  - e) Good interpersonal/teamwork skills;





- f) Computer literacy with a working knowledge of common computer applications and systems;
- g) Good drafting, reporting, communication and presentation skills;
- h) Ability to liaise with a diverse range of people and stakeholders; and
- i) Proficiency in one of the African Union working languages (Arabic, English, French, Portuguese, Spanish or Swahili). Knowledge of one or several other working languages would be an added advantage.
